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Purpose

Exodus & Resilience does not only execute cultural programmes: it produces knowledge about them. Applied research converts curatorial and community practice into transferable knowledge: documented methodologies, validated theoretical frameworks, verifiable data and accessible publications. Research starts from situated knowledge: all knowledge is produced from a specific position and that specificity is an epistemic strength, not a limitation.

Research lines

Art and migrant cultural citizenship

Investigates how contemporary art builds cultural citizenship for displaced communities: rights, access, participation and symbolic recognition.

Cultural mediation and critical pedagogy

Examines mediation practices that produce transformative learning in migration and diversity contexts. Engages Freire, hooks and UNESCO's ESD framework.

Living archive and migrant memory

Investigates documentation methodologies that activate —not only conserve— migrant community memory. Works with living archive and intangible cultural heritage.

Superdiversity, territory and social cohesion

Analyses how Exodus & Resilience programmes contribute to social cohesion in high migratory diversity contexts. Connects with Vertovec and Putnam.

Academic partnership profile

Exodus & Resilience seeks collaboration with universities and research centres that want to produce knowledge from cultural and community practice. Academic & Knowledge Partners have access to programmes in execution as a research field and contribute to publications, evaluations and applied research.

Migration studies

Researchers in migration, diaspora and social cohesion with interest in applied research.

Fine arts and design

Researchers in curating, cultural mediation and community art.

Education

Researchers in critical pedagogy, intercultural education and transformative learning.

Cultural heritage

Specialists in intangible heritage, community archive and intergenerational transmission.

Communities that are the subject access results before publication and can add perspectives or corrections.
