## Purpose of the applied study

The applied study is the format for in-depth analysis at Exodus & Resilience. It examines a specific initiative in its territorial context: the assumptions it started from, the decisions it made, the processes it activated and the results it produced. Its purpose is not to document success but to learn honestly: what worked, what changed and what must improve. It constitutes a public learning resource and an instrument of institutional accountability.

## Structure of each study

### 01 · Territorial context

Diagnosis: documented needs, actors, institutional gaps and cultural conditions. Answers why this place and this moment.

### 02 · Working hypothesis

Inquiry framework orienting the initiative: what is believed may happen, with what prior evidence and what risks are identified from the design.

### 03 · Applied methodology

Intervention stages, tools, documentation criteria and design decisions. Includes adjustments made during the process and the justification of each significant change.

### 04 · Programme activation

Activities carried out: participants, partners, resources mobilized and artists. Primary source of the study's quantitative indicators.

### 05 · Mediation processes

Sustained accompaniment: bonds generated, situated learnings and tensions identified. Source of the study's qualitative indicators.

### 06 · Outcomes and limits

Indicators, verifiable sources, scope of claims and methodological limits. Includes what could not be measured and learnings transferable to other nodes.

## Documentation principles

### Traceability

Every data point is accompanied by source, responsible, date and methodology. No indicator is published without its methodological context.

### Honesty about limits

The study explicitly declares what could not be measured and what changed from the initial hypothesis. Evaluation is learning, not marketing.

### Open access

Studies are published with open access under Creative Commons with attribution. Citable in academic and institutional contexts.

### Community review

Communities that are the subject access conclusions before publication and can add perspectives not captured by the platform's methodology.

## Inter-node transfer

Applied studies are the main learning mechanism across the four territorial programmes. A mediation protocol developed in Barcelona can be adapted for New York. An oral history methodology tested in Acarigua can inform archive work in Caracas. The platform produces knowledge that accumulates, circulates and improves across territories.

Each study concludes with a transfer section that explicitly evaluates which elements are replicable, under what conditions and with what necessary adaptations.
